Cultural Diversity / Special Investigative Topics ICC:

July 16 & 17, 2009 (Thur & Fri)

Fee: \$10.00 16 Hours

This course is required by TCLEOSE on a four year cycle. Every officer must attend the 3939 to remain in compliance with TCLEOSE.

Cultural Diversity and Special Investigative Topics are courses mandated by TCLEOSE. All officers are required to take the courses once every 4 years. Cultural Diversity will educate the officer to different types of cultures they may encounter. Special Investigative topics are comprised of five sections: child abuse and neglect; family violence; sexual assault; sex offenders; and general legislative changes. Class size is limited to 20 students

Crime Scene Investigation ICC: July 20 – 24, 2009 (Mon – Fri)

CLASS IS FULL

Fee: \$10.00 40 Hours

Intermediate Core Course covering all aspects of crime scene search and techniques, evidence recovery, latent print recovery, securing the crime scene, and some photography techniques. Students will participate in a mock crime scene evidence recovery exercise and present their findings and conclusions of the case.

Active Shooter: July 30 & 31, 2009 (Thu, Fri)

CLASS IS FULL

Fee \$10.00 16 Hours **Class size is limited to 15 students**

This is a moderately physically demanding course. Students will cover the legal issues and officer's responsibilities relating to active shooter incidents. Students will learn, develop and practice various active shooter scenarios using various weapons.

Crisis Intervention Training ICC: August, 25 & 26, 2009 (Tue & Wed)

Fee: \$10.00 16 Hours

This course meets the standards recently set by TCLEOSE for the mandated crisis intervention training. Law enforcement personnel will receive training in areas such as non-physical approach emphasizing communications and active listening techniques the better educated officer is about an issue the better able he/she is able to respond appropriately and professionally. Utilizing these techniques the officer will be better equipped to de-escalate certain

Tactical Handgun: September 17 & 18, 2009 (Thu, Fri)

CLASS IS FULL

Fee: \$25.00 16 hours **Class size is limited to 15 students**

This course will consist of advanced handgun techniques and applications in varied situations such as low light, use of flashlight, shoot-no-shoot decision making, moving targets, multiple targets and malfunction clearing. Students will be required to bring their primary handgun, standard duty rig and 3 magazines/speed loaders, ear / eye protection, and a flashlight. This course has limited registration. Each student will need to bring with them 300 rounds of ammunition.

Ethics in Law Enforcement: September 22, 2009 (Tues)

Fee: \$10.00 8 Hours

Ethics and Integrity in Law Enforcement is a two day class designed to address the ethical challenges law enforcement face every day. The class format takes an interactive approach to discuss real-life situations, determine why we make the choices we do all in light of the increased demand to respond to community needs. The training is designed to generate plenty of discussion and offer decision-making models to prepare participants with options in making ethical decisions. Class size is limited to 20 students.
